

"How To Gauge A Pigeon With More Keel Bone Upfront"

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Put your thumb in the small bone protruding by the wing. Put your 4th finger horizontal to your thumb finger. Your last small finger will be your gauge to check the extra bone structure if there is any, 1 extra finger is good... 2-3 extra fingers will be excellent...

The birds with no extra bone structure in front... most of them are being culled, if it is an inbred bird and you wanted the lineage...mate it with a bird with 2 -3 small fingers of extra bone structure upfront...thereby you are compensating in breeding not to breed flat birds, upfront in their keel bone structure....





This is the best picture Alfredo Ramirez and I can take...Practice will help you gauge them accurately...Good luck in selecting your one loft race entry. Hope this one is a big help.
